

Introduction

As the largest Child and Family Health organisation of its kind in Australia, and renowned as a leading accredited early parenting support service, Tresillian continues to go from strength to strength. Meeting the goals of our Strategic Plan 2021-2024, we have increased accessibility, expanding services across the state to meet the diverse needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families and culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities. An increased focus on perinatal and infant mental health remains a priority to support the well-being of families.

Furthermore, construction of state-of-the-art facilities at Tresillian Wollstonecraft will offer a centre of excellence for future generations. The result will be an architecturally designed purpose-built Centre catering for parents with one child or multiple who need support. The new Centre is expected to be operational in November this year.

On the digital front, we will soon be launching our new website, which features greater accessibility and a broader range of specialist early parenting resources.

Our Services

Primary Services

Tresillian offers several accessible 'first stop' options for parents with general concerns over their baby or toddler.

- The Tresillian Parent's Help Line FREECALL 1300 272 736, operates 7 days a week from 7am to 11pm. Parents with parenting concerns can ask for advice from a Tresillian Nurse or self refer to a Tresillian service.
- The Tresillian website (www.tresillian.org.au)
- Tresillian social media channels on Facebook, Instagram and YouTube.
- The SleepWellBaby App provides broad parenting support for families with newborns through to children aged up to 5 years.

Tertiary and Secondary Level Services

To book a visit to Tresillian, parents can:
- obtain a referral from their local health professional

- self refer via the Tresillian website
- call the Tresillian Parent's Help Line

Day Services

Tresillian delivers a combination of face-to-face Centre based appointments, telehealth individual consultations and home visiting. Specialist parenting groups, facilitated by Tresillian Nurses and Psychologists/Social Workers are held regularly for new parents wanting to seek practical advice on their baby, on a particular topic. Fees for Day Services and groups are covered by Medicare.

Residential Services

Tresillian's inpatient Residential services located at Canterbury, Nepean, Wollstonecraft, Macksville, and Curtin (ACT) are for parents experiencing more complex parenting challenges. Families live in for 4 nights/5 days. In most cases, parents have usually had a Day Service before admission to Residential. A referral is required with costs covered by Medicare or the family's private health fund. Psychology support is available.

Specialist Programs

Virtual Residential Parenting Program

The VRPS is a free 'virtual' parenting program operating over 4 nights/5days enabling families to access parenting support from a Tresillian child and family nurse, GP, psychologist, or social worker. This service is available 24/7 making it ideal for those living in remote locations or with multiple children who

would find it difficult to access face-to-face support at a Tresillian Centre.

Telehealth Virtual Consultations/Parent Groups

Tresillian's Virtual Telehealth consultations and parenting groups are available free of charge to families across NSW and the ACT. Parents can obtain a referral for an individual consultation; or choose to join a group program 'virtually' on a particular topic.

Parent Groups

Group programs are facilitated by Tresillian's child and family health nurses and often psychologists in Tresillian Centres and the community. The groups operate during school terms and focus on topics such as 'Getting to know your baby', 'Supporting Sleep in new babies' and 'Postnatal Depression'.

Extended Home Visiting

Services offering intensive support for families with vulnerabilities impacting their parenting capacity.

Tresillian's Education Professional Practice and Innovation Centre (EPPIC)

The PPIC provides a range of professional development initiatives to build the capacity of Tresillian's internal staff team along with delivering learning courses and Conferences to health professionals working in child and family health services.

Guthrie Early Learning Centre

Tresillian's only long day care Centre is based at Tresillian Wollstonecraft and has capacity for 42 children aged under 6 years.

On behalf of Tresillian's Board of Directors, I'm pleased to present the Tresillian Annual Report for the financial year ending June 30th, 2023.

With the opening of seven new Tresillian services in the past year and the construction of Tresillian Wollstonecraft well underway, Tresillian remains committed to supporting families with young children and making it easier for them to access our services regardless of where they live.

78,071 contacts were made with a Tresillian service last year, a massive increase from just over 60,000 contacts made in the previous twelve months. This encompasses clinical and allied health contacts in our Centre based day services, residential inpatient care facilities, calls taken on the Tresillian Parent's Help Line and advice delivered through outreach and telehealth consultations. Many more visited our website for resources. It has been a privilege to support Tresillian's dedicated management and staff during this time of rapid expansion and their dedication to working more effectively.

The established expertise of Tresillian's parentcraft nurses in supporting young families' emotional health and well-being has grown since the pandemic. They are now more confident in the early identification of perinatal anxiety and mood difficulties and are being better supported by specialist perinatal mental health nurse specialists, allied health and medical specialist advice when necessary. With this unique combination of skills and by working as a team or in partnership, holistic care to stressed parents and their infants is available under one roof to ensure the best start in life for infants and their parents. Further building this capacity is the main priority of our Strategic Plan.

The Board monitors the Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) and is pleased the CEO, Rob Mills, has championed this initiative. Already Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are accessing our services in greater numbers than previously and while we have taken the first steps there's much to be done. We are indebted to our dedicated Aboriginal health workers for helping us engage more effectively with the youngest members of their communities.

We were deeply saddened to learn of the passing of our much-admired monarch, and Patron, Queen Elizabeth II. As an organisation, we are incredibly

proud and honoured to have had Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II as our Patron since 1954. Recognised as one of the world's most enduring leaders, she embodied dignity, strength, and humility during her 70-year reign. Queen Elizabeth II will remain Tresillian's Patron pre-accession.

It was an honour to be invited to present at the *The First 1000 Days Conference*, at the Southern Cross Club, Woden ACT on Tuesday, 8th November 2022. The event, sponsored by the ACT Government, was a collaboration between Tresillian, Marymead and Perinatal Wellbeing Centre and was held during Perinatal Mental Health Week. The Conference brought together over 250 researchers and clinicians from a range of disciplines including many Tresillian staff, passionate about fostering a better understanding of perinatal mental healthcare and early parenting support. There were some lively and robust discussions and insightful presentations including from Tresillian's Deborah Stockton.

We are delighted to announce that Channel 7 journalist, Sarina Andaloro, has joined Tresillian as an Ambassador. Our other high-profile Ambassadors include Erin Molan and Yvonne Weldon, who kindly provide ongoing support to Tresillian. This last 12 months has exceeded all expectations as Tresillian continues to expand and grow, meeting our Strategic Goal of remaining accessible to all families, regardless of where they live or their financial circumstances.

As one of the most highly regarded early parenting services in Australia, we deliver evidence-based care during the first 2000 days of a child's life, a critical time for development. Tresillian services help improve the long term health and wellbeing outcomes for families and communities. Furthermore, we provide world-class clinical education and training for current and future health professionals.

There were many highlights this year! Firstly, the 'Topping Out' ceremony on the 1st December 2022 when we marked another exciting milestone in the construction of Tresillian's new Wollstonecraft Centre. A Wollemi Pine tree was hoisted from a crane to the tallest point, a tradition that is said to bring good luck to its occupants for many years to come! Joining us was the NSW Premier, The Hon. Dominic Perrottet MP, together with The Hon.

Bronnie Taylor MLC Minister for Mental Health, Regional Youth and Women, and our Local Member, Felicity Wilson MP. The Premier spoke about the positive impact Tresillian has on supporting new families when often things don't go according to plan with their baby. The new facility will operate seven days per week and offer support to more parents than previously. The new facilities include a 14-bed Family in-patient Residential Unit and increased capacity in Day Services. An Education venue on the top floor will accommodate more education programs for health professionals and parents. Construction is expected to be completed by early November 2023.

In June 2023, the NSW Health Minister Ryan Park MP, announced the extension of another two years funding for Tresillian's seven Family Care Centres in Goulburn, Grafton, Armidale, Griffith, Cowra, Muswellbrook and Moruya as well as our five Tresillian 2U Mobile Early Parenting Vans and the four residential in-patient beds at Macksville Hospital. We're extremely grateful to the NSW State Government for their ongoing support.

Digital transformation has been a key strategic focus, with the launch of the Virtual Residential Parenting Service, funded by the NSW Ministry for Health. This free 'Virtual' 4-night/5-day service enables families access to parenting support from a Tresillian child and family nurse, GP, psychologist, or social worker. This service is available 24/7 making it ideal for those living in remote locations or with multiple children who would find it difficult to access face to face support at a Tresillian Centre.

To expand the breadth of Tresillian's digital capabilities and improve accessibility for parents and health professionals, in February, work commenced on a new Tresillian website which is expected to be completed later this year. NSW parents continue to have free access to the SleepWellBaby (SWB) App, developed in partnership with Tresillian by SleepFit. The App has now had over 80K downloads. Tresillian continues to work closely with SleepFit so families can share their saved data with clinicians on admission to Tresillian.

To streamline the self-referral process, we introduced a new online referral pathway to complement the current option where contact is made with the Tresillian Parent's Help Line. Families wanting to know more about referral, now complete a short form on the Tresillian website and are contacted within 72 hours by a Tresillian Nurse who advises them on the best Tresillian service to meet their needs. This new pathway has proven highly successful generating a significant increase in referrals to all services. More and more parents are now using the online form rather than calling our Help Line. Health professionals continue to refer families using a separate portal.

Community Events

Again, Tresillian was well represented at community Expos across the state including the Parents, Babies and Children's Expos in both Sydney and the ACT. These provide excellent opportunities for nursing staff to meet with new and expectant parents and explain the benefits of our services.

Sale of Tresillian Willoughby

Tresillian Willoughby was sold in December 2022, with a delayed settlement until the new Wollstonecraft Centre opens. Tresillian originally purchased the Willoughby property in 1927. The decision to sell followed extensive investigation and planning by Tresillian's Board and management into how Tresillian can continue to provide the best early parenting services and facilities for families. Proceeds from the sale will be directed







to Tresillian's Capital Assets Account and invested in providing more services to ensure all parents have access to the help they need. Staff and Residential services will move from Willoughby in late 2023 to Tresillian's new early parenting centre at Wollstonecraft.

To farewell the historic Centre, staff hosted a community 'Open Day' on Saturday, 24th June 2022 at 2 Second Avenue, Willoughby. Hundreds turned out to visit one last time, with nursing staff taking escorted tours around the historic house that Tresillian has called 'home' for 96 years. Rooms were set up to look just as they would have in days gone by! Joining the celebrations were Local Member, Tim James MP, the Mayor of Willoughby, Tanya Taylor and Tresillian Ambassador, Yvonne Weldon. Special thanks to all those volunteers who gave up their time to help, especially those who worked on the trash and treasure stall, the sausage sizzle, cake stall and face painting. Several thousand dollars was raised from the event.

Each year, our staff team of nurses, midwives, medical specialists, allied health staff, management, cleaning staff and administration staff dedicate themselves to families with a baby or young child. We thank them for their commitment to providing quality care. We also extend a heartfelt thanks to our volunteers who selflessly give their time throughout the year. From helping our parents find





This has been a year of mighty achievements which showcase what we can do when we band-together. For me the stand-out mighty things are the establishment of the Brains Trust group, the new clinical models for Tresillian's QEII Family Centre in the ACT; the Parent Infant Early Childhood Mental Health (PIEC-MH®) and the Occupancy Rates project.

But first is the acknowledgement of Jane Le Gras the Early Childhood Teacher who has worked at our Guthrie Early Learning Centre for 40 years! She was acknowledged by Frank Guthrie's family, past Board members, many past families including their grown up children; all of whom have an ongoing special place in their hearts for Jane. It is also a credit to Director Jackie Stewart that she leads her team and Jane in a culture of success (high engagement and morale) despite the many challenges the exciting Wollstonecraft capital works have presented. Their can-do attitude to band-together and find the positive wins through every time.

We banded-together to establish the Brains Trust group made up of key clinical and corporate managers. This weekly collaborative 'Brains Trust' meeting has become a dynamic forum for sharing of information and problem solving 'in action'. It sets the tone for the week where we pool our combined intellects to reduce risk and enhance safety of clinical and operational issues as they arise; and transform and improve parents' and staff experiences.

Central to the Brains Trust is a way of working in a collaborative person-centred way (McCormack and McCance 1997), guided by the key staff who attended a 5-Day International Practice Development School at North Sydney. The values that shape the thinking (See word cloud below), are dynamic and reviewed regularly by the group.

This Brains Trust way of working is a wonderful instrument that transcends individual effort into a product where the whole is more than the sum of its parts; and that will guide Tresillian's nurturing and innovative culture over many years.

We banded-together to navigate a very difficult start of the year for the team at Tresillian's QEII Family Centre in the ACT, when the Centre had to remain closed for face-to-face client care due to capital works during January 2023. Almost overnight, the clinical team had to convert their face-to-face services to virtual mode and provide all services as day services with some home visiting. On top of it all, this was done against the backdrop of a new digital health record. The group was nominated for a Nursing and Midwifery Excellence award; and although they didn't win on the night, they truly deserved our commendation for so bravely standing up a service for the ACT families, despite considerable odds.

In addition the QEII team has also implemented the full clinical model that includes residential and day services with packages of care tailored to the needs of the family. They are pioneers as well because they've started a new onenight residential program that may have exciting implications for the other residential services in NSW. Watch this space!

The Parent Infant Early Childhood Mental Health© (PIEC-MH®) Service Model is headed up by a multidisciplinary clinical leadership team (allied health, nursing and psychiatry) to provide clinical governance in the assessment and intervention of clients with perinatal mental illness with a view to promoting secure resilient family relationships.




The PIEC-MH[®] leadership team, who have now been in place for a year, oversee the delivery of metropolitan, regional and interstate perinatal and infant mental health services. Already we are seeing enhanced clinical, research and collaborative opportunities with the newly commissioned Naamuru Parent Baby Unit at Sydney Local Health District (SLHD) and Mother Baby Unit at Westmead; Western NSW Local Health District (LHD) Head to Health Kids Hub, and the Mid North Coast LHD Parent Child Relationships Program. In addition, we've seen enhanced parent-child clinical experiences for the trainee psychiatrists jointly supervised with the LHD and Tresillian's PIEC-MH® psychiatrist. A definite upward trajectory for the service which could only have been achieved by the banding together of the multidisciplinary leadership team setting the direction for the nursing/ midwifery and allied health clinicians in the provision of perinatal and infant-early childhood mental health services.

Finally, the Occupancy Rates Project showcases what is possible when different departments of Tresillian band together to adopt a multi-pronged approach to attracting and retaining families that need a residential service. The approach was designed and monitored through the Brains Trust group and scaffolded by the amazing abilities of public relations and marketing, corporate business, our Parent's Help Line, Centralised Intake and every manager and clinician working in the residential units. A truly whole-of-Tresillian approach. This is a work in progress but the trajectory towards full occupancy is very pleasing.

This project relied on many elements to synchronise and achieve outcomes but highlights included a re-design of the Tresillian website and a self-referral 'bypass button'; a re-design of the Centralised Intake Service to provide a 7-day Clinical Nurse Specialist and strategies to address the well-being of the hard working workforce. Sankalpa sessions and clinical supervision using the FAN model remain deeply committed investments at Tresillian.

Another inspiring and stimulating year and one that again confirms to me that Tresillian is a truly great place to work.







Governance, Risk and Performance

Workforce changes

There were a number of changes in this portfolio over the year. The acting Director of EPPIC, Fran Chavasse, relocated to be closer to family in September 2022, leaving this position in the hands of Kelly Stone until the appointment of the new Director of Workforce Learning and Development. Katherine Schaffarczyk commenced with Tresillian in April 2023, bringing with her over 25 years of nurse educator experience. Her first task was the recruitment of an educator to replace Natalie Cameron, who chose not to return from her maternity leave. Judith Kotowski, who was undertaking Natalie's maternity leave relief was successful with her application and was appointed as the Nurse Educator, Willoughby and Wollstonecraft, in May 2023. Rosa Maidment continued to provide support to clinical services at Queanbeyan Day Services until Dec 2022, returning to her role as regional Nurse Educator following the Christmas closure.

New Nurse Educators, Nicole Fleming and Emma Monagle commenced at Tresillian QEII in November 2022. Together they are job-sharing the role left vacant by Seren Pearsall who has returned to clinical services.

Dr Anne-Marie Maxwell joined Tresillian in January 2023 as the new Research Manager following the resignation of Dr Jessica Appleton, who took up a teaching and research position at UTS in September 2022. Dr Maxwell joins Tresillian following a post-doctoral research year with Macquarie University.

Tresillian QEII was able to successfully recruit a Quality and Safety Officer position, with Madeleine Hornby commencing in the role in June 2023. This position will assist with preparations for accreditation and the maintenance of WHS at this Centre.

Quality Management

Tresillian, including Tresillian QEII, moved to an online clinical audit platform in July 2022. All clinical services are now able to complete their clinical audits using this platform, with reports available to clinical services on their performance. Comparative reports across services are provided monthly, and

managers are able to view their performance over time using a web based portal.

The corporate audit program transitioned to an online platform in January 2023, allowing Tresillian visibility over all service completion and results. Each manager is provided with prompts to assist in completion and reporting is multi-functional.

Tresillian commenced its preparation for short notice assessments with the establishment of Standard Lead and teams. A range of resources have been developed to support these teams with evidence collection and curation.



WORLD CLASS NET PROMOTER SCORE 2022-2023

Net Promoter Scores (NPS@) are held up as the gold standard customer experience metric.

An NPS above 75 is considered word class by the creators of the score.

NPS scores are reported from -100 to +100. Tresillian undertakes this measurement across all services.

NPS scores for Tresillian Residential Services were reported at 90.3% and Day Services 94.1%

Incidents

There was an overall decrease of 18.9% in reported incidents when compared to the previous financial year. There was a decrease of 29.3% in the overall incident rate when compared with the previous year. All NSW Health benchmarks for completion were met. There were no Harm score 1 or Harm score 2 incidents reported at any Tresillian Centre.

Tresillian's QEII Family Centre, ACT

Total incident reported decreased by 50% when compared with the 2021-22 year, with the decrease seen in most categories reported. Clinical management incidents decreased by 57.1% when compared with 2021-22. There were no significant incidents reported at the centre.

Client Satisfaction

Client satisfaction remains high across all areas of the service. Tresillian reported a World Class Net Promoter Score with overall satisfaction rates of 92.1% for the period July 2022 - June 2023, a slight increase compared to the previous year. Residential services reported overall satisfaction

rates of 90.3% for the period, no change from the previous year. Day Services clients also reported high levels of overall satisfaction for the same period, reporting overall satisfaction rates of 94.1%, an increase from the previous year. Satisfaction for Tresillian QEII residential clients remained high with 90% reporting overall satisfaction with the service received.

Health Information and Clinical Informatics

Health Information is overseeing, with the assistance of some administrative staff, the transition of health records from the Willoughby site to the new Wollstonecraft building. Older records have been catalogued and sent to the government repository,

while current records will be maintained at Willoughby until service relocation. The health records for Willoughby and Wollstonecraft will be amalgamated once this occurs. The transition of Lismore's health records to Northern NSW Local Health District was also facilitated.

A review and update of all clinical forms for use at Tresillian's Albury Wodonga Mother and Babies Unit took place enabling electronic access by clinical staff at this service.

Tresillian took part in NSW's Privacy Awareness Week which ran 1-7 May with a theme of 'Back to Basics': Privacy Foundations NSW'.

Clinical informatics and the Governance Support Manager assisted staff as Tresillian migrated to Microsoft 365 and the NSW Health State-Wide Active Directory. This ensured a consistent and stable platform for future technology upgrades and continued access to state-wide applications for Tresillian staff and services.

Tresillian's QEII Family Centre, ACT


Health Information and Clinical Informatics services worked with staff from the QEII Centre and ACT Health to facilitate the implementation of Epic and the Digital Health Record (DHR) in November 2022. Staff were supported with training, the development of "how to" guides and "at the elbow" support during the go live process. Work had been undertaken in the months leading up to deployment of the new eMR to transition clinical forms to their electronic counterpart and to train staff in their completion.

The transition to Objective was also supported by this team.

Education Professional Practice and Innovation Centre (EPPIC)

Education activity steadily increased over the year with 575 education sessions provided across the state, to over 3,000 attendees. This was an increase in service provision of 28% when compared to the previous year. Work was completed on a new learning and development framework for Tresillian, which will be released in the second half of 2023.





Tresillian's OEII Family Centre, ACT

At our QEII Centre in the ACT, mandatory training was reviewed and realigned with that of Canberra Health services, following transition of staff to HRIMS to support online learning and compliance with mandatory training. Reporting against this revised listing commenced in April 2023. Provision of education sessions has increased by 180% in 2022-23 when compared with 2021-22 seeing an additional 5% throughput of staff.

First 1000 Days Conference

Tresillian partnered with Marymead and the Perinatal Wellbeing Centre to present The First 1000 Days Conference in Canberra in November 2022, with the support of the ACT Government. This Conference brought together over 250 clinicians to facilitate open and constructive dialogue based on evidence and practice, to foster a better understanding of perinatal mental healthcare and early parenting support.

Work Health and Safety

Work Health and Safety Covid-19 Restrictions have continued in NSW Hospitals even though our alert system has been downgraded to yellow. There has been some relief for staff working in administrative areas who are no longer required to wear surgical masks, however for staff in clinical areas surgical masks, physical distancing and limitations on the amount of people that can be in a room at any given time has remained the same throughout the winter months of 2023. The good news is that as of September 2023 we are now able to operate in our clinical areas without anyone having to wear a mask. We continue to screen all clients to ensure

that they are in good health prior to admission during their stay at Tresillian and, as always we place great emphasis on hand hygiene for all staff, our families and visitors to our Centres.

Research

Key Achievements

Evaluation of First 2000 Days Project, Northern NSW

Located in the Clarence Valley region, the Northern NSW First 2000 Days project is led by a consortium of four members: Tresillian Family Care Centres, Northern NSW Local Health District, Bulgarr Ngaru Medical Aboriginal Corporation, and Healthy North Coast PHN. Tresillian is collaborating with researchers at Charles Sturt University who are undertaking an evaluation of this service. 2022 saw development of the evaluation framework through a thorough community co-design process, and formation of an Aboriginal Advisory Circle to offer local Aboriginal governance.

Partnering with researchers at Macquarie University to enhance staff resilience

Nursing and administration staff at Tresillian participated in an intervention study on occupational resilience coordinated by researchers at Macquarie University. Following an initial consultation period, a tailored resilience training program was provided to consenting staff, who completed surveys pre-and post-intervention and at 2-month follow-up. Some staff also participated in focus groups to discuss adapting the program for parents. Data collection has been completed and analysis and reporting will take place during 2023.

Mindfulness for Mums pilot study

This study will evaluate the effectiveness and acceptability of an 8-week mindfulness meditation-based program among post-natal mothers attending an early parenting service. Ethics approval was granted in 2022 and the study commenced in 2023.

Higher Degree Research Students

Tresillian currently has four staff who are undertaking their PhD, and two undertaking a Masters degree where a Treatise is included, which is adding to the collective research capacity within the service. In addition, two Tresillian staff submitted their PhD in the last year:

Ms Deborah Stockton (Public Health, University of Technology Sydney) submitted her research "An exploration of the extent to which existing metropolitan Level 2 child and family health service models can be implemented in diverse settings".

Ms Judy Kotowski (Nursing, University of Technology Sydney) submitted her research "The infant feeding modality of bottle-feeding."

Completion of Master's degree

Ms Hayley Briggs completed her Master of Advanced Nursing in Health Research (University of Technology Sydney). Her research project was a mixed method systematic review examining the impact of asynchronous, accelerated onlineonly courses on post-graduate student learning performance and satisfaction.

Financial Report

Peter Quinn, Chair: Tresillian Finance, Audit and Performance Committee

Operations

For the year ended 30 June, 2023, Tresillian Family Care Centres reported an operating surplus of \$1,406,919. This is an increase of \$268,509 on the previous year. Total income increased by \$3,828,833 and total expenditure increased by \$3,560,324 on the previous year. Noting, included in the surplus for the year are Capital Grants totalling \$960,000 for the purchase of four Tresillian 2U Mobile Vans. The vans will be depreciated in future years.

The 2022-23 year has again presented a number of challenges. The continuing construction of our new Wollstonecraft Family Care Centre has been the major focus, with an emphasis on the works progressing in a timely manner, but also within budget. At the time of writing, the new building is scheduled to commence service in November 2023.



The year also marked the bedding down and consolidation of our seven new Day Service Centres throughout Regional NSW, five new Tresillian 2 U Mobile Van services along with our Virtual Residential Parenting Service (VRPS). Tresillian would like to thank the Ministry of Health for continuing to support our vision to provide Tresillian services to families throughout NSW.

Other exciting projects in progress include a complete redevelopment of the Tresillian website, due to launch at the end of 2023, the redevelopment of the playground area at our Guthrie Child Care Centre and the refurbishment of Carpenter House.

State of Resources

The balance of current assets, being cash at bank, current receivables, investments and the reclassification of our Willoughby property pending final settlement of contract for sale has decreased by \$5,094,219 during the year. Non-current assets, being property, plant and equipment and right of use leased assets increased by \$8,298,178. The decrease in current assets is due to the funding of the new Wollstonecraft development, as reflected in the increase in non-current assets. Total liabilities including creditors, provision for future staff entitlements, deferred income and lease liabilities increased by \$1,797,040. The net effect is reflected by a surplus of \$1,406,919.

As the largest provider of early parenting services in Australia, Tresillian continues to rely on the generous support of NSW Health, ACT Health, our corporate partners, and donations from members of the general public. The funding and support plays a major role in helping Tresillian continue to deliver outstanding services to families.

I would also like to thank my colleagues on the Tresillian Board including the Finance, Audit and Performance Committee along with the contractors working with the Board on the upgrade and development of our Wollstonecraft facility.


