Tresillian is the largest Child and Family Health organisation of its kind in Australia with services in New South Wales, the ACT and Victoria. It's also a leading accredited early parenting service assisting thousands of Australian families during the early years of their child's life through services such as Residential (Inpatient) care, Centre based Day Services, a Parent's Help Line, online 'live chat' service from a Tresillian Nurse and a fully resourced website. Our health professionals support new parents experiencing challenges with their baby or toddler during the early years, helping them to gain confidence in their own parenting skills.

In New South Wales (NSW), Tresillian's services are based in metropolitan Sydney at Canterbury, Nepean, Wollstonecraft and Willoughby. In regional NSW Tresillian is located at Wagga Wagga, Lismore, Dubbo, Coffs Harbour, Taree, Queanbeyan and Broken Hill. In the ACT, Tresillian is based in Curtin and in Victoria, at Albury Wodonga. Introduction

The past year was a memorable and fitting celebration of Tresillian's 100 years of serving generations of Australian families. Established in 1918 the Royal Society for the Welfare of Mothers and Babies (now Tresillian), has made an extraordinary contribution to child and family health and continues to be a leading Early Parenting Health Service. This year, in line with Tresillian's Vision that 'All expectant families and those with infants and young children across Australia, have access to parenting advice, support and care which will enable them to raise their children with confidence within their own cultural context and values', Tresillian has grown from strength to strength, consolidating and building new partnerships with local health districts in regional NSW, interstate and at an international level, in China. Our clients and their families remain at the centre of our services, underpinned by the dedication and commitment of our staff across all disciplines.

Partnerships with Regional Communities

One of the most exciting developments over the past 12 months was the announcement of funding by NSW Premier, The Hon. Gladys Berejiklian MP for an additional five new Tresillian Centres offering Day Services and telehealth virtual consultations to families living in regional areas at Dubbo, Taree, Coffs Harbour, Queanbeyan and Broken Hill. A new mobile early parenting van, "Tresillian 2U" was also launched in



partnership with the Mid North Coast Local Health District to visit local and remote communities. The opening of a landmark Tresillian Service in these areas is a huge win for local families, saving sleep deprived parents from having to make the trip to Sydney to access specialist support.

Interstate and International Partnerships

In an exciting new chapter in our history, Tresillian opened services for the first time outside Australia in Chengdu, China. The dedicated child and family health service was launched in March in partnership with CHS Healthcare and there are plans for many more to open in coming years.

In another first, in June, the ACT Minister for Health and Wellbeing, Meegan Fitzharris, awarded Tresillian Service Provider for the QEII Family Centre, a 13-bed residential unit continuing the care provided by the Canberra Mothercraft Society since 1963. This is the first Tresillian residential unit to open outside of metropolitan Sydney.

Moving Forward

One of the most significant announcements for the organisation this year was the approval of a Development Application from North Sydney Council, to re-develop one of Tresillian's flagship Centres, Tresillian Wollstonecraft in 25 Shirley Road, Wollstonecraft, originally bequeathed to Tresillian by the Carpenter Family in 1940. Securing the funds to build the \$17M state of the art child and family health 'Centre of excellence' remains a top priority.

Digital Growth

Contacts with a Tresillian service including the Parent's Help Line, Tresillian Live Advice, Residential admissions and Day services, totalled around 65,000 in the last financial year. Our digital footprint also continues to grow meeting the needs of parents sourcing parenting trusted information online. Our 'You Tube' video series covering a range of parenting topics has proven extremely popular with parents with close to 110,000 views over 12 months. The Tresillian Facebook community has grown to 32,000 followers and the Tresillian Website, tresillian.org.au, continues to be an excellent resource, with over 1.3M unique page views throughout the year.

Tresillian's Centenary Gala Ball

The Ball was a highlight of our Centenary year and was celebrated on the 27th October, 2018, in the same place Tresillian was established in 1918, Sydney Town Hall. Glitz and glamour prevailed as we welcomed over 500 guests including the Hon. Tanya Davies MP, many former and current staff, Board members, friends and family. Guests arrived on the red carpet with a champagne entrance. Flapping in the wind along George Street were banners proudly bearing Tresillian's logo, on what was a perfect night in Sydney. Spoilt with an amazing array of musical entertainment, the The Three Tenoz's sung a moving rendition of 'When a Child is Born'. Sincere thanks to the enthusiastic Ball Committee who worked tirelessly for over 12 months ensuring that the evening was an outstanding success.

The 100th Annual General Meeting

The last financial year has proven to be one of the most remarkable in our history as we celebrated the second half of our Centenary year and moved into 2019 with renewed energy. Expansion of additional Tresillian services to families in regional New South Wales continues to be a key focus of our achievements.

As part of the NSW Government's \$157 million funding commitment to support new families, Tresillian received \$2.2 million per year (\$8.8M over 4 years) commencing in July. We

The funds were allocated to open five new regional Family Care Centre hubs in New South Wales in partnership with the Local Health Districts in Queanbeyan, Coffs Harbour, Dubbo, Taree and Broken Hill for vulnerable families. All five new Centres provide Level 2 child and family health services for families residing across the Local Health Districts in which they are located. Services include Centre-based consultations, home-based consultations, extended home visiting service for families experiencing complex difficulties and vulnerabilities, group programs and telehealth video-consultations to extend the reach of the services.



Juerview Services

Tresillian provides a range of support services to families across New South Wales, the ACT and Victoria. These include:

- Residential Inpatient Units at Canterbury, Willoughby and Nepean with a total of 86 beds (43 for parents and 43 for their babies); (From 1st July) Curtin, ACT with a total of 26 beds (13 for parents and 13 for babies).
- **Day Services (both Centre**based and home-based) located in metropolitan areas, including Sydney's Inner West (Canterbury), Lower North Shore (Wollstonecraft) and Western Suburbs (Nepean); and regional services based in the Northern Rivers region (Lismore and a satellite service in Grafton), Riverina (Wagga Wagga); Southern NSW and the North-East Border Victoria (Albury Wodonga); Hunter New England Area (Taree), Mid North Coast (Coffs Harbour), Western NSW (Dubbo), Far West NSW (Broken Hill) and Southern NSW (Queanbeyan and a satellite service in Cooma).
- Tresillian 2U The Early Years Parenting Service (Mobile Van), was developed in partnership with Mid North Coast Local Health District and launched in October 2018, the first of its kind in Australia. The model includes a team of Child and Family Health Nurses and Aboriginal Health Workers collaborating with local health services.
- Tresillian is in the process of developing a 4-bed residential service, co-located in the Maternity Unit in the new Macksville Hospital opening in 2020.
- The Early Intervention Home Visiting Program is an extended home visiting program aimed at improving children's development and wellbeing and supporting the capacity of those in a parenting role for up to one year.

- The Tresillian Parent's Help Line (open 7am-11pm Monday to Sunday) offers advice and support from qualified child and family health nurses.
- Tresillian Live Advice an after hours Monday-Friday web-based service providing parents with advice and support from an accredited Tresillian nurse;
- The Tresillian website, tresillian.org.au received over a million visits last year, and offers a range of information and resources for parents and health professionals;
- The Tresillian social media channels has a community of over 36,000 where families can connect for more support and to share stories.

In addition to these services Tresillian:

- collaborates with Corrective Services supporting incarcerated mothers and their families;
- has an extended home visiting program for parents with complex needs implemented through special project funding;
- undertakes partnerships with other non-government organisations to provide services, for example a

service providing a residential drug and alcohol abstinence program for women and young children; and

 peer support groups (Tresillian MyTime) for parents and carers of children with a disability or chronic medical condition.

Tresillian's Professional Practice and Innovation (PPIC) Centre aims to:

- support Tresillian staff develop their clinical skills
- provide high quality education programs for Tresillian staff and external professionals who work with families and young children
- assist with the translation of child and family health evidence into clinical practice
- assist with the implementation of the UTS and Tresillian Graduate Certificate in Child and Family Health Nursing
- develop parenting education and child and family health professional resources
- develop Tresillian's research capacity
- provide consultancy in child and family health for government and private organisations
- seek funding to design, implement and evaluate innovative child and family health services and interventions.



Tresillian on the Move



The Tresillian story began over one hundred years ago in 1918 with the formation of the Royal Society for the Welfare of Mothers and Babies at the Sydney Town Hall.

The Society was a NSW government initiative sparked by soaring infant mortality rates and a desperate shortage of health services for new mothers.

The need for intervention was exacerbated by the First World War, which left many young mothers widowed. In the same period 60,000 babies lost their lives through poverty, disease and lack of hygiene.

The Society's primary aim back then was to make a difference to the high mortality rate of children under the age of five.

The Society initially responded to the problem at home with a community education program for parents of small children.

The Society's aims as outlined in the 1920-21 Annual Report, were:

- To Save Life.
- To co-ordinate all agencies dealing with mothers and babies.
- To ensure proper Nursing Conditions to every mother prior and subsequent to Childbirth
- To establish Welfare Centres and Committees in the metropolis and country.
- To establish rest Homes for Mothers
- To establish a Corps of Mothers' Aids
- To care for and bring under supervision all children up to school age
- To provide certified and humanised milk, and ice.

In 1921, Dr Margaret Harper, the first Medical Director established an "Infant Welfare Training School at 2 Shaw Street, Petersham to educate Baby Health Centre nurses so they could be more effective in helping parents address basic problems such as a lack of hygiene and immunisation programs.

A baby clinic for parents also opened. The clinic at Petersham had been named "Tresillian" by the previous owners who originated from the village of the same name in Cornwall, England and from then on, the Royal Society for the Welfare of Mothers and Babies was referred to as "Tresillian".

When the Willoughby Centre was purchased in 1927 the name was retained and this Centre became known as Tresillian North. By the mid-1920's the infant mortality rate had fallen to 3% from a peak of over 10% just a few years earlier.

As times changed, Tresillian's scope had adapted and broadened with specialised nursing, medical and psychological support available on site and across mediums such as the internet and on the telephone.

The primary goal of Tresillian today remains unchanged: that of securing the best possible life and future for young Australians.

With over 100 years of invaluable service for your young families, Tresillian continues to play an important and vital role in Australian history.





Our 100th year has proven one of the most successful in our history.

Top of the list of great things achieved is a change in culture from reaction to consolidation and ambition. In last year's Annual Report I referred to the Team Nursing model, the Standardised Model of Care for Day Services and the NCAST Parent Child Interaction assessments - see diagram to the right.

This laid the foundations for further great achievements in the year to June 2019 as follows:

• In the residential units we were scaffolded by the team nursing model to implement the NCAST Parent Child Interaction (PCI) Feeding & Teaching Scales into 'business as usual'. These scales help assess the mother-infant interaction during a feeding or teaching interaction which

then leads to an individualised intervention plan that recognises the importance of the first relationship and focuses on the infant's social-emotional health. Tresillian commissioned a new four bed residential unit which will be co-located with the maternity unit of the brand new Macksville Hospital due to open in early 2020.

Tresillian was successful with the Tender to the ACT Health Directorate to administer the Queen Elizabeth II Family Care Centre in Curtin, ACT, which was announced in June 2019. Tresillian commenced as Service Provider from 1st July, 2019 The Standardised Model of Care for Day Services outlined the flexible context of service packages based on the needs of the families which supported the successful proposal to government for five additional regional centres from July 2018. Thanks to the investment from Tresillian's corporate, clinical and administrative teams, all five centres, as well as additional satellite services, including the highly successful Tresillian 2U mobile van, were operational by June 2019. This was a massive achievement!

From these foundations:

- Nurses on Tresillian's Parent's Help Line are now documenting information on Cerner (an electronic medical record), for families currently booked for a Residential admission or being seen in Day Services, to improve care coordination and the families' experience of Tresillian services.
- Tresillian's Extended Home Visiting Program underwent a business process redesign to integrate it with Day Services at Tresillian Canterbury as well as to provide guidance to all Day Services (regional and metropolitan), to safely meet the complex needs of families with vulnerabilities. This program won the annual Sydney Local Health District Child Protection and Wellbeing Award on the 5th September 2018 for its contribution to the prevention and/or intervention of child abuse and/or neglect.



Allied Health Services are available to parents across all Tresillian Centres.

 Tresillian's Telehealth videoconsultations commenced in August at the Albury Wodonga Health Tresillian Parents and Babies Service as well as at the Tresillian in Murrumbidgee Family Care Service. The service gives families living significant distances from specialist child and family health support services, increased access to help. It is now increasingly part of our Centre based Day Services.

At Tresillian, we're continually reviewing that we truly make a difference to our families. We do this using a range of tools including the validated parenting selfregulation scale *Me As A Parent*, as well as embarking on research to continually evaluate our service model.

A highlight was the re-designed referral process which resulted in parents being given a single point of contact to arrange their Day Service or Residential booking, 7 days a week, equalising wait times across the organisation for all Priority 1, 2 and 3 referrals and



maintaining occupancy rates in the residential units to >85%. It was cost neutral, thanks to the goodwill and investment of the administrative and clinical staff from day and residential services.

In other news, the Director Psychology and Social Work, was accepted for the Executive Clinical Leadership Program at the Clinical Excellence Commission to review father inclusive practices and explore innovative clinical design models to enhance efficiency measures. This coincided with new national and state father inclusive initiatives and Tresillian is now represented on

the Fatherhood Expert Advisory Panel led by Associate Professor Richard Fletcher. Group programs specifically for new Fathers are held on Saturdays and Wednesdays at all Tresillian Residential centres. This important work will continue.

Tresillian continues to provide MyTime groups for parents and carers of children with a disability, developmental delay or chronic medical condition. Parents, grandparents and carers can meet at a MyTime group to socialise, share ideas and build a network. Since 2006 Tresillian has partnered with community organisations in NSW to provide a total of 14 MyTime groups. Nine MyTime groups are in rural and regional NSW from Tweeds Heads in the north to Cooma in the south. Five groups are in Sydney metro area, including a Men's Group in Marrickville and a group in Randwick for parents facing palliative care options for their children. Great support.

The Sankalpa program to develop mindfulness, compassion, selfcompassion and stress reduction skills continues to play a positive

role in our valuable workforce. Eight staff members have completed or are working towards completing Sankalpa Facilitator training with the establishment of Sankalpa mindfulness sessions at all metropolitan Tresillian Centres, most of them facilitated by trained Tresillian staff.

A highlight of the last 12 months was the Centenary celebrations that

continued across Tresillian Centres. They brought together former and current staff along with key referral agents. We were honoured to have several NSW Members of Parliament join us at these events.

As always, the above achievements are testament to the wonderful work of our clinical leaders and their teams who are ably supported by our administrative staff.

It's my pleasure to present the following report on the operational activity in Corporate Services during what has been a highly productive year.

The Professional Practice and Innovation Centre (PPIC)

Tresillian Family Care Centres has a long tradition in the provision of education and training for nurses and other health professionals working with infants, children and families. Over the past 12 months. the staff of the Professional Practice & Innovation Centre have continued to increase the range of educational programs and activities for Tresillian staff and health care professionals in the wider child and family health community. We were delighted to welcome Kelly Stone and Janice Wright into the PPIC team. We also celebrated the significant contribution of Jan Aiello to nursing and education at Tresillian, and wish her well in retirement.

Tresillian had a trade display stand at several major parenting Expo's in Sydney and regional NSW.

Highlights included:

- Welcoming new staff from metro and regional sites in Tresillian orientation sessions during the year
- Hosting a sold-out Tresillian Centenary Conference with over 200 participants and a wonderful agenda of noted speakers by Nikki Brown, Tina Hourigan and Amanda Joubert
- Contributing to the successful QEII tender and then welcoming the QEII team at their Tresillian induction in July 2019
- Development of a new Tresillian book for parents of newborn babies by Fran Chavasse, Senior Nurse Educator



- Delivery of the Graduate Certificate of Child and Family Health Nursing in partnership with UTS, by Nikki Brown, Mary McDonald, Jan Aiello and Kelly Stone.
- Coordination and leadership of the Advanced Nurse Practice Program by Tina Hourigan, Nurse Educator. This 12-month course prepares child and family health nurses for working in the Sustaining NSW Families (SNF) home visiting model.
- Support and education for the implementation and use of the NCAST parent-child interaction assessments in a variety of ways including through formal delivery of training, recertification and clinical support
- Providing clinical education and support to an increasing number of newly qualified Enrolled Nurses and Child and Family Health nurses into the Tresillian workforce by our unit educators, Mary McDonald, Jan Aiello, Kelly Stone and Janice Wright
- Event management assistance with the Team Building Day, Parent and Baby Expos, workshops conference and Circle of Security training.
- Working closely with Child Health Solutions in China in country and via video conference

Tresillian has a vibrant research program with a joint focus of contributing to child and family health knowledge, service development and evaluation. The role of the Tresillian Chair is to assist Tresillian staff develop an active program of research.

To further support Tresillian's research agenda Dr Megan Anderson has been employed to help with the management of internal research programs and integrate validated tools into clinical practice to enable measurement of clinical outcomes of the services we provide.

Currently, Tresillian has three active internal research projects and involvement in two external research projects. Where possible Tresillian joins with other like organisations to participate in research project. Current research projects include: the Parent Child Interaction Assessment study within the Tresillian residential units; and the Evaluation of a Sequential Postnatal Depression and Circle of Security Parenting group. Tresillian is involved in a collaborative research study with SleepFit and HCF to Inform and Validate a User-Friendly Assessment for a Digital Program to Improve Sleep Outcomes for Infants and Young Children. Joint external research studies include: Providing Care and Support for Parents of Premature Babies at home: Health Visitor [HV] and Nursing knowledge in partnership with University of Technology Sydney and University of

Hertfordshire; and Gunhi Dhurinya Gurray Mangga: Mother Born Small Baby (Improving the health and well-being of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander mothers of premature babies). As an outcome of our research, peer-reviewed papers have been published in professional journals.

The past year has involved the development and implementation of four child and family health subjects in the Wuhan University Hope School of Nursing Masters program, China. Three of the four subjects have been implemented, the fourth subject will be taught later in 2019. Eight students have enrolled in the four subjects. The second phase of the project was the development of a child and family health nursing course for the Wuhan University Vocational School. This course will be implemented in the second six months of 2019. The development of clinical parenting services in China has provided numerous opportunities to share Tresillian's nurse led model of care and nursing expertise with invitations to speak at conferences and workshops in Beijing, Wuhan and Shenyang.

Quality; Work, Health & Safety; Client satisfaction

Client satisfaction remains high across all areas of the service. Tresillian reported overall satisfaction rates of 90.9% for the period July 2018-June 2019. **Residential services reported** overall satisfaction rates of 87.3% for the period. Day Services clients also reported high levels of overall satisfaction for the same period, reporting overall satisfaction rates of 93.8%. Tresillian's new regional services began collecting client satisfaction in January 2019, with overall satisfaction ratings for the six months at 97.4%.

Incidents and complaints There was a 9.2% increase in reported incidents during 2018/19, but no significant change in the number of clinical incidents reports. The increase can be attributed to an increase in reported hazards and property reports. Overall there was a decrease of 15.5% in the number of client falls reported and no change in the number of incidents that resulted in a report of minor harm. No serious (SAC2) or significant (SAC1) incidents were reported.

The complaint rate for 2018/19 remains very low at 0.2 complaints per 1000 occupied bed days. The overall number of complaints has been decreasing over the last six years, however, communication issues are still the most common issue raised. Work has been undertaken with staff to highlight the need to highlight the reasons why a client may perceive information is not clearly or appropriately conveyed to them during their interaction with Tresillian.

Clinical Audit

Clinical audit with Tresillian is embedded within the clinical units monitoring core practice. Where the threshold for compliance is not 100%, a threshold of 85% has been set prior to a formal action plan being developed by the Nurse Unit Manager to improve compliance. During 2018/19 compliance with threshold increased by 18.5%.

Capacity Development

Tresillian supported two clinical staff to undertake the Clinical Excellence Commission's Clinical Leadership Program with both staff successfully completing a work sponsored improvement project as part of the curriculum.

WHS

Tresillian undertook its biannual Work Health Safety and Injury Management Audit in late May. Feedback from the auditors was positive and Tresillian looks forward to receiving the final report and overall outcome from the audit. There was a 14.3% decrease in reported staff incidents over the period, with a corresponding decrease in reporting harm as a result of a staff incident of 5.5%.

Infection Control

There were no infectious outbreaks reported within Tresillian during the 2018/19 year. There was a decrease of 37.3% in the number of infectious incidents reported when compared with 2017/18. Parents continue to be provided with education on Tresillian's Infection Control Program as part of the admission process including the importantance of hand hygiene in preventing the spread of infection.

Tresillian's hand hygiene compliance rate continues to be high with compliance at 97.7%. The national benchmark set by the Australian Health Ministers' Advisory Council has been at 80% since 2017. Tresillian has consistently exceeded this benchmark.

During this period, 75.82% of users came from organic traffic, an increase of 79.71%.

The most popular topics continue to be Settling/Crying related, Baby's Daily Activities and breastfeeding, bottle-feeding and introducing baby to solids.

Treasurer's Report



Operations

For the year ended 30th June 2019, the Tresillian Family Care Centres recorded an operating surplus of \$390,731. This is an increase of \$200,731 on the previous year. Total income increased by \$2,494,159 and total expenditure increased by \$2,293,428 on the previous year. The year was highlighted by the establishment of five new centres across regional New South Wales with new funding provided by the NSW Government; as well as new services in Chengdu, China, as Tresillian continues to grow and expand its services.

Over the last six years, Tresillian has grown significantly, with a strategic vision of helping more families access our services. As well as opening new Family Care Centres in regional areas, a Tresillian 2U Mobile Parenting Van was launched late last year on the NSW Mid North Coast in partnership with Mid North Coast Local Health District, providing much needed child and family health services to those local communities. During this period, revenue increased \$5,308,704 (32%) and net assets \$1,140,782 (19%).

State of Resources

The balance of current assets, being cash at bank, current receivables and investments has increased by \$1,479,142 during the year. Total liabilities including creditors and provision for future staff entitlements increased by \$1,089,798. Noncurrent assets, being property, plant and equipment increased by \$1,387. The net effect is reflected by a surplus of \$390,731.


